

Poileasaidh Gàidhlig

Tha Oilthigh na Gàidhealtachd agus nan Eilean ag aithneachadh gu bheil a' Ghàidhlig agus an cultar a tha co-cheangailte rithe fighte fuaithe ann an saoghal cultarail, dualchas is fèin-aithne nàiseanta na h-Alba.

Tha an t-oilthigh dealasach airson nan amasan a tha ann am Plana Nàiseanta na Gàidhlig, a' gabhail a-steach na Ro-innleachd Nàiseanta do dh'Fhoghlam Gàidhlig, agus dealasach cuideachd a bhith a' cluich páirt chudromach ann a bhith a' déanamh cinnteach gum bi àite seasmhach aig a' Ghàidhlig ann an Alba san ùine air thoiseach mar chànan beò.

Bidh Oilthigh na Gàidhealtachd agus nan Eilean gnìomhach a thaobh a bhith:

1. A' cur ri faicsinneachd agus cleachdad na Gàidhlig tro na stuthan agus na gnìomhachdan aige fhèin.
2. A' brosnachadh cultar na Gàidhlig tro churraicealam, foillseachaidhean agus tachartasan an oilthigh.
3. A' trusadh luchd-obrach aig a bheil sgilean Gàidhlig freagarrach, mar as iomchaidh do na dreuchdan aca anns an oilthigh.
4. A' brosnachadh an luchd-obrach agus a' toirt taic dhaibh, ge be dè an dreuchd a th' aca, a bhith a' togail agus a' leasachadh sgilean Gàidhlig.
5. Ag adhartachadh chothroman taobh a-staigh curraicealam an oilthigh airson ionnsachadh na Gàidhlig, a' gabhail a-steach foghlaam tro mheadhan na Gàidhlig, ionnsachadh na Gàidhlig agus cultar na Gàidhlig. Bidh cothroman ionnsachaidh na Gàidhlig rim faotainn tro mhodalan bogaidh cho math ri bhith rim faotainn tron oilthigh agus nas fhaide às. Gabhaidh seo a-steach ionnsachadh na Gàidhlig taobh a-staigh roinnean eile de churraicealam an oilthigh.
6. A' gabhail rannsachadh os làimh tron Ghàidhlig agus rannsachadh air cànan is cultar na Gàidhlig, a' gabhail a-steach an eòlais fhoghlaim a bhuineas do bhith a' teagasc tro mheadhan na Gàidhlig.

'S ann tro Phlana Gàidhlig an oilthigh a thèid a Phoileasaidh Gàidhlig a chur an gnìomh, agus thèid seo a sgrùdadadh le Comataidh Ghàidhlig an oilthigh.

Gaelic Language Policy

The University of the Highlands and Islands recognises that Gaelic and its associated culture is an integral part of Scotland's heritage, national identity and cultural life.

The university is committed to the objectives set out in the National Plan for Gaelic, including the National Gaelic Education Strategy, and to playing an important part in ensuring that Gaelic has a sustainable future as a living language.

The University of the Highlands and Islands will be pro-active in:

1. Contributing to the visibility and usage of Gaelic through its own materials and activities.
2. Promoting Gaelic culture through the university's curriculum, publications and events.
3. Recruiting staff with appropriate Gaelic language skills, relevant to their roles in the university.
4. Encouraging and supporting all staff, regardless of their role, to acquire and develop Gaelic language skills.
5. Promoting opportunities within the university's curriculum for Gaelic learning, including Gaelic-medium learning, Gaelic language learning and Gaelic culture. Gaelic learning opportunities will be available through intensive immersion models as well as being made available throughout the university and beyond. This will include Gaelic language learning embedded within other areas of the university's curriculum.
6. Undertaking research through Gaelic and research into Gaelic language and culture, including the pedagogy of Gaelic-medium education.

The implementation of the university's Gaelic Language Policy will be through its Gaelic Language Plan, monitoring of which will be undertaken by the university's Comataidh Ghàidhlig.
